On behalf of the City and County of Honolulu ("City"), Department of Design and Construction (DDC), we invite you to attend a Public Informational and Environmental Impact Statement Preparation Notice (EISPN) Scoping Meeting for the Hale'iwa Improvement District (ID) Project.

The DDC is directed by the City Council Resolution No. 09-338, CD1 to prepare and submit a preliminary report to the City Council in accordance with the ID process established in the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu (ROH), Chapter 14, Articles 23 through 29. The ID being contemplated is for the construction of walkways, undergrounding of utilities and installation of landscaping along Kamehameha Highway between the 'Ōpae'ula Stream Bridge, also known as "Twin Bridges", and the Anahulu River Bridge within the Hale'iwa Special District. The project limits are shown on the attached figure.

In compliance with ROH Chapter 14, Article 33, the City's *Complete Streets Ordinance*, the DDC is employing a multi-modal approach and considering complete streets features in project planning and in the development of project design concepts. The *Complete Streets Ordinance* expresses the City's commitment to encourage the development of roadway facilities that balance the needs of pedestrians, bicyclists and motor vehicles to provide safe mobility for all users. The DDC is developing and evaluating alternatives for the ID Project through a community involvement program consisting of stakeholder interviews, community workshops and public meetings. The City is preparing an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) in conformance with Hawai'i Revised Statutes Chapter 343 and Hawai'i Administrative Rules Section 11-200. The DDC is currently preparing an EISPN as the first step in the EIS process.

The purpose of the meeting is to present and gain community input on preliminary conceptual design alternatives and complete street features contemplated for the project. Community feedback will be used to refine the project alternatives prior to evaluation in the Draft EIS. In addition, we are asking for the community's help to identify relevant environmental, social and technical issues related to the ID project that should be evaluated through the EIS process. Meeting outcomes and issues identified by the community will be documented in the EISPN.


